This month we were delighted to attend the graduation ceremony for 215 children. 140 of graduates who were able to submit internship marks in first stage were given certificates. Those who submitted internship marks in second phase will receive certificates in July 2017.

They were trained in the years 2015 and 2016; in good partnership and collaboration with Rwanda Aid, Rusizi District, WDA and parents. There is a hope to see them using their skills as a contribution for the development of Rwanda, especially on Nkombo Island.

In second term, from May up to June we visited Lead teachers while they were conducting School Based In-service (SBI) training in both Rusizi and Nyamasheke Districts.

We also visited School Based Mentors whose task is to give support to their fellow teachers. Participants in SBI-training, were working in groups and they have much appreciated the training.
